Subject: Conditions on the Middle Fork and Vermilion River

I, CPT. Matt Viverito report the conditions prompting the boating restriction are no longer significant. IDNR Lands Staff, and the Vermilion County Sherriff's Office concur with the assessment.

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources has authorization to lift the Restricted Boating Area designation when navigation is no longer significantly dangerous.

#### Section 2030.80 Hazardous Navigation Conditions - Designated Restricted Boating Areas

In the event that the Department of Natural Resources determines the presence of conditions that make navigation of a body of water significantly dangerous to the public, the Director of the Department of Natural Resources may, in coordination with the federal government, designate Restricted Boating Areas on any affected body of water within the jurisdiction of the State of Illinois. This designation shall be made by public announcement in local media and by posting at local public boat launches and marinas, and the restricted area shall be physically marked by buoys, signs, manned watercraft or yellow police tape. This designation will remain in effect until the Director of the Department of Natural Resources determines that navigation is no longer significantly dangerous to the public, but in no case shall the designation remain in effect longer than 90 days. Recission of the Restricted Boating Area designation shall be publicly announced in local media and posted at local public boat launches and marinas and any markings shall be removed.

I recommend the Restricted Boating Area (recreational vessels only) be lifted on the Middle Fork and Vermilion River effective on 4/06/2026. If you approve, please sign below, and the Office of Law Enforcement will coordinate lifting the Restricted Boating Area designation with the local authorities.
