IDNR accepting applications for Illinois Natural Areas Stewardship grants

IDNR will accept applications through June 16 for <u>Illinois</u> <u>Natural Areas Stewardship grants</u>. The goal of this grant program is to increase the delivery of much needed stewardship activities to natural areas protected within the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission system. Stewardship needs throughout the state have continued to outpace the ability to deliver these services by individuals, volunteers, organizations, and government agencies. The program is designed to fund projects that immediately address this deficiency and begin to expand on the stewardship capacity of Conservation Land Trusts through grants that will expand their staff and equipment for these activities.

Hunters Apply for Fall Turkey Hunting Permits Illinois residents only can apply for a <u>fall turkey hunting</u> <u>firearm permit</u> through July 2.

Deer Firearm and Muzzleloader Firearm Hunting Application Information

Deer firearm and muzzleloader firearm hunting permit second lottery applications are available for nonresidents and Illinois residents who did not apply or were not successful in the first lottery drawing can apply through June 30.

Nonresident Combination Deer Hunting Archery Lottery Application Information

The nonresident combination archery lottery application period is June 1-30. This is an online-only application, only for nonresidents. Apply on <u>www.ExploreMorelL.com</u>. If awarded, hunters receive one Either-Sex Archery permit and one Antlerless-Only permit. Limit of one application. IDNR mails permits to successful recipients after the lottery drawing.

More than 16,000 wild turkeys harvested during Illinois' spring season

Turkey hunters harvested a preliminary statewide total of <u>16,121 wild turkeys</u> during the 2023 Illinois spring turkey season. This compares with the 2022 statewide turkey harvest of 13,701.



Illinois Conservation Foundation accepting nominations for the 2023 Illinois Outdoor Hall of Fame

Since 2002, the foundation has recognized individuals who have records of exemplary service in and commitments to improving conservation efforts and outdoor recreation opportunities in Illinois. Nominations must be submitted on the official <u>Hall of Fame Nomination form</u> by July 14, 2023, to be considered.
