# **Message from Director Natalie Phelps Finnie**



Memorial Day weekend marks the unofficial beginning of the summer boating season, and I want to remind everyone to be safe anytime they're on or near the water, whether it's boating, fishing, kayaking, or other water-centered activities. This year, National Safe Boating Week is May 17-23. Did you know the Illinois Department of Natural Resources offers boating safety education classes throughout the year? Anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 1998, must have a valid Boating Safety Certificate, but the program is excellent for

boaters of any age. Go online to learn more about the program.

Whenever you recreate on or near the water, it's important to remember these important safety tips:

- Always wear a life jacket. Be sure to have the type of life jacket that's appropriate for the activity you're doing, whether it's floating, kayaking, water skiing or fishing. Not only is it a good idea, it's also the law. Illinois requires that personal flotation devices, or PFDs, be available for each person aboard a boat or other watercraft. Illinois also requires everyone to wear a PFD while operating a personal watercraft or jet ski.
- Never operate a boat while under the influence. Boating accidents often involve impaired operators. The Illinois Conservation Police strictly enforce laws for operating under the influence on Illinois lakes and rivers.

Always make safety a priority while on the water and be sure to get out there and enjoy all the great water recreation Illinois has to offer this season.
