Message from Director Natalie Phelps Finnie



Have you purchased your 2024 fishing license yet?

Fishing licenses for the 2024 season are now on sale both online and at <u>local vendors</u>. These licenses are good until March 31, 2025.

I want to thank everyone for buying their fishing licenses. Revenue from license sales is used to fund fish management, research, and outreach. Your purchase directly funds these vital conservation activities.

For trout anglers, the 2024 Illinois spring trout season opens Saturday, April 6 at 58 ponds, lakes, and streams throughout the state. The daily harvest limit for each angler is five trout. All anglers, including those who intend to release fish caught before April 6, must have a fishing license and an inland trout stamp unless exempt.

Trout stamp purchases provide funding for the Illinois Catchable Trout Program, allowing IDNR to stock more than 80,000 rainbow trout each year in bodies of water where trout fishing is permitted during the spring season. An additional 80,000 trout are stocked for the fall trout season, which begins in October.

For information about all site regulations, anglers should contact individual sites that will be stocked with catchable-size trout. Not all sites are open for trout catchand-release season and not all sites open at 5 a.m. opening day.

The spring trout season offers opportunities for families to get outdoors and enjoy fishing. In Illinois, fishing is free for children under the age of 16, which makes the spring trout season a great time to get youth involved in outdoor recreation.

The 2024 <u>spring turkey hunting season</u> begins April 8 in the south zone and April 15 in the north zone. Park visitors please be aware that sections of parks may be closed for hunting.

The 2024 <u>youth spring turkey hunting season</u> continues April 6-7. The north zone and south zone are open concurrently for both days.

Seventeen <u>Illinois Schoolyard Habitat Action Grants</u> totaling more than \$55,200 have been awarded for habitat development at schools and other public places.



Illinois bobcat season concludes with 370 harvested The 2023-2024 <u>Illinois bobcat season</u> concluded Feb. 15 with 370 bobcats harvested by hunters and trappers. A total of 214 (55%) of bobcats were taken by hunting, while trapping accounted for 156 (40%) of the harvest.
