

It is unlawful


- To injure or remove any plant or animal or part thereof.
- To remove, take or deface signs of buildings.
- To collect or take any artifacts.
- For any person to enter or remain in any area closed to use.
- For any person to operate a metal or mineral detector without a permit.
- To collect firewood or operate a chain saw or sound amplification system.
- To place signs or distribute advertising on DNR property.
- For any person to swim, wade or enter the water.
- For any person to operate any motor vehicle, mini bike, motorcycle or ATV on trails.
- For any person to camp outside of the designated camping areas.
- For any person to possess or discharge any type of fireworks or explosive devices.
- For any person to build a fire anywhere except in camp stoves provided in designated areas.

Rules & Regulations

A common sense guide to enjoying the trails in the park.

1. Bikers MUST yield to pedestrians.
2. Bikers MUST stay on surfaced trails.
3. Bikers are asked to ride slowly.
This trail is not designed for high-speed biking which is dangerous for bikers and pedestrians.
4. Littering is prohibited.
5. Dogs, cats and other domesticated animals MUST be leashed at all times.
6. No Firearms, including a BB gun, air rifle, slingshot, bow and arrow, switchblade/knife, tomahawk or axe are to be used on the trail under any circumstance at any time!
7. Groups of 20 or more are required to obtain a Activity Permit from the Site Superintendent in advance of a visit. (please allow up to 3 weeks for approval, a \$25 fee applies)



Biking Rules


- Bikers must yield to pedestrians.
