Subject: Illinois Habitat Fund Advisory Committee Action

The Illinois Habitat Fund Advisory Committee held their annual meeting on October 6, 2021. The Committee's responsibility is to review and recommend the allocation of funds in the Illinois Habitat Fund.

Committee Business Recommendations

The Committee voted to recommend that the Department host a special Committee meeting within 6 months to work through some recurring issues including:

- Allowing the funding of UTVs
- Hunting access as a ranking criteria
- Funding land acquisition by non-DNR entities
- Clarification of the rules governing cash advances under GATA
- Explanation of payment delays to grantees

I wholeheartedly endorse the recommendation for the special meeting and am happy to discuss if you would like.

Funds available were unexpectively low this year. The IDNR did not request any Habitat funds in hopes that more external grants could be funded.

The Committee recommended funding the six highest scoring grant applications.

\$ 50,000 Ducks Unlimited – Copperas Creek Wetland enhancement for replacement of failed outdated water control structures.

\$ 70,400 Quail and Upland Game Alliance — Woody Succession Program — a program that offers landowners assistance with removing woody succession and brushy areas to improve bird habitat.

- \$ 85,000 Pheasants Forever/Quail Forever Chapter habitat projects assisting landowners with brush management, prescribed burns, invasives removal, native plantings and pollinator plants.
- \$ 36,630 McHenry County Conservation District Preservation and restoration efforts at Pleasant Valley Conservation Area, establishing high diversity prairie, adding additional acres of oak savanna and grazing grasslands for bison. Includes the purchase of a flac-vac seed harvestor to process 1,330lbs of of native seeds gathered by the habitat teams.
- \$115,120 Shawnee Resource Conservation District An open canopy project that assists landowners with forest stand improvement, invasives removal and control and prescribed burns on forested oak ecosystems.
- \$174,416 Pheasants Forever/Quail Forever Support for the Illinois Rexcreational Access Program Habitat Strike Team, conducting habitat work on private lands enrolled in IRAP that provides semi-controlled public access on sites throughout west central Illinois.

The Committee recommended not funding nine applications.

These eight grant proposals were scored lower, and there were insufficient funds leftover once the highest scoring proposals recieve funding.

\$ 67,010 Quail and Upland Game Alliance – Habitat BONUS Program – Offers landowners bonus payments for completing wildlife friendly management work on both CRP and Non-CRP acreage.

\$ 66,387 Quail and Upland Game Alliance - SAFE Incentive Program - Offers landowners an incentive payment of \$100 per acre for signing up acreage for the USDA SAFE program. \$ 125,000 Champaign County Forest Preserve - Land acquisition of 105 acres of watershed floodplain and a forested area continguous with the St. Joseph Wetland (CCSWCD) and the Kickapoo Rail Trail (KRT). 20,000 City of Rock Island - Restoration of ten acres to pollinator meadows. \$ 100,000 Kane County Forest Preserve - Enhance wetland quality within a large marsh and restore wetland associated upland habitat at Pingree Grove Forest Preserve. \$ 300,000 DuPage County Forest Preserve - Contractual Restoration of Herrick Lake Forest Preserve, activities were to include invasives removal, prescribed burns and native plant seeding. \$ 65,935 Pollinator Partnership - A project to provide support for personnel and costs associated with a project in north eastern Illinois where volunteers gather native plant seed and the IDNR Mason State Tree Nursery assists with seed cleaning and grow-out of native plant plugs for distribution for re-planting in natural areas. \$ 145,232 Heartlands Conservancy – A project to provide support for Land Stewardship Manager to assist the Conservation Manager to improve habitat on public and private lands, working to improver habitat on various public lands and provide technical assistance to landowners, and leading volunteer stewardship activities on public lands.
