FEATURES

Also known as the white face fly, this species is about 0.40 to 0.60 inches in length. Its head and thorax are much lighter in color than the dark, shiny abdomen. There are large bristles on the body.

BEHAVIORS

The adults eat flower nectar and act as pollinators. The female lays her eggs on forest tent caterpillars (Malacosoma disstria), fall webworms (Hyphantria cunea), corn earworms (Helicoverpa zea) and cutworms. The egg hatches to a larva that burrows in to the living moth larva, eating it and eventually killing it.
