

"By the Numbers" summary information from the Illinois Endangered Species Protection Board's revision of the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species, effective 05/19/2015.

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#### Introduction

The Illinois Endangered Species Protection Board (Board) completed in 2014 its work on the required 5-year review of the Illinois List of Endangered and Threatened Species (Illinois List). The review process began in 2012 with the Board reviewing approximately one taxonomic group at each meeting through February 2014. In June 2014, the Board held its required public hearing to receive comments on proposed changes and finalized its decisions in August 2014. Board staff prepared necessary proposed Illinois Administrative Rule amendments and submitted them in mid-September to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) for the IDNR to move them through the process as required. The rules went to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules in February 2015 and the new Illinois List became effective May 19, 2015.
