subject: Duck Stamp Committee Action –State Projects Only

The State Duck Stamp Committee met on May 15, 2023 to review the IDNR proposals for funding from the Migratory Waterfowl Stamp Fund for fiscal year 2023. There was an estimated \$250,000 available for state projects, and there was a total of \$1,973,400 in requests.

The Committee recommended \$250,000 in funds be encumbered for the following new state projects:

The Committee also recommended that the \$1M funds allotted to Carlyle Lake for the rehabilitation of Speaker Lake be reallocated to levee repair on the site to address more pressing threats (see justification below) During the FY2019 Migratory Waterfowl Stamp Fund (Duck Stamp) meeting, the Committee voted to provide \$1,000,000 towards the Subimpoundment Rehabilitation (Phase 1) effort at Carlyle Lake SFWA (19-014D). Because of continued embankment erosion along the Kaskaskia River, sections of Levee "A" and Levee "C", must now be reinforced or risk failure. A section of "C" levee has already sloughed off and is directing more flow towards the remaining embankment, which is exacerbating the issue. After undertaking a similar repair along a 300' length of levee A, the cost to repair the two identified sections approaches the \$1,000,000 cost figure. Therefore, the DNR is requesting the committee reallocate the \$1M from the rehabilitation effort to the embankment repairs. Repair efforts can likely be initiated within the next few months, whereas the rehabilitation efforts are still a couple years out. The current "concept" design costs for the rehabilitation of the Speaker Lake area range from \$7M to \$20M.

Please let me know if you desire any additional information on these projects and recommendations. Upon your decision, the OGMA grant staff will inform the members of the State Duck Stamp Committee and get the capital funds released.
