In accordance with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Preservation Fund Grant # 02-008W, dated June 15, 2001 to Lake Bluff Open Lands Association (LBOLA) entitled; "Reseeding of Prairie Remnant - Lake Bluff Forest Preserve" to be used for in conjunction with LBOLA's "Open Lands Day" which concentrated on a native plant planting and re-seeding effort, we submit our report as detailed in the agreement. Per the reporting requirements specified in the grant agreement, please find enclosed six copies of this report and a completed pay request certification form.

In summary, this "Open Lands Day" appears by all accounts to have been a great success. LBOLA's Spring 2002 Newsletter was distributed throughout the village announcing our "Open Lands Day" activities which brought out approximately one dozen citizen volunteers. In addition to the newsletter, an article announcing award of the grant was published in the local paper, the "Lake Forester". (Copies of both announcements are included as Appendix A).

Aided by an additional one dozen Middle School students, volunteers "plugged" away at planting hundreds deep-rooted native grasses and forbs in the project area. (A location map has been provided in Appendix B). The project area has been a priority for LBOLA and preserve users alike after being identified as a worthy restoration candidate from a previous 1998 IDNR Small Project Program funded site inventory that was prepared by Dr. Wayne Schenum for the 80-acre Lake Bluff Forest preserve.

Prior to the planting and earlier this year, LBOLA in cooperation with the Lake County Forest Preserve District (LCFPD) and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, had expanded the prairie remnant with a local landscaping contractor who cut and removed the non-native buckthorn and honeysuckle thicket that was encroaching on the area. Earlier in the spring, locally supplied prairie seed from the LCFPD was sown into the project area.

The plants were sited into the previously cleared areas, as native vegetation was lacking due to the dense non-native canopy that formerly shaded the bare ground. After the plugs had been planted, a cover crop of eight pounds of Canada Wild Rye was sowed into the project area to hopefully suppress weeds from overtaking the area and provide fuel for a future prescribed burn. Throughout the morning, volunteers were offered food and refreshments as we sensed that our efforts had made a significant improvement in the effort to expand and preserve the prairie remnant. Photographs from "Open Lands Day" are also included as Appendix C with this report.

Matching grant given to LBOLA

Lake Bluff Open Lands Association (LBOLA) is pleased to announce the award of a matching grant from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, IDNR Small Grants Program for the restoration of the 'Birch Prairie' located in the eastern most corner of the Lake County Forest Preserve's Lake Bluff Preserve.

The Lake Bluff Preserve, an 80 acre site including ancient bur oak forest, wetlands, prairie and a man-made lake designed by renowned turn of the century landscape architect Jens Jenson, straddles the

Lake Forest / Lake Bluff border between Green Bay Road and the Skokie River.

During a previous IDNR funded site inventory of the Lake Bluff Preserve, the Birch Prairie was identified by local naturalist Dr. Wayne Schennum as a rare native prairie remnant.

In cooperation with the Lake County Forest Preserve, funding from this IDNR grant will be used to reseed and transplant native wildflowers and grasses in areas of the Birch Prairie where LBOLA's recent volunteer restoration efforts have concentrated.




