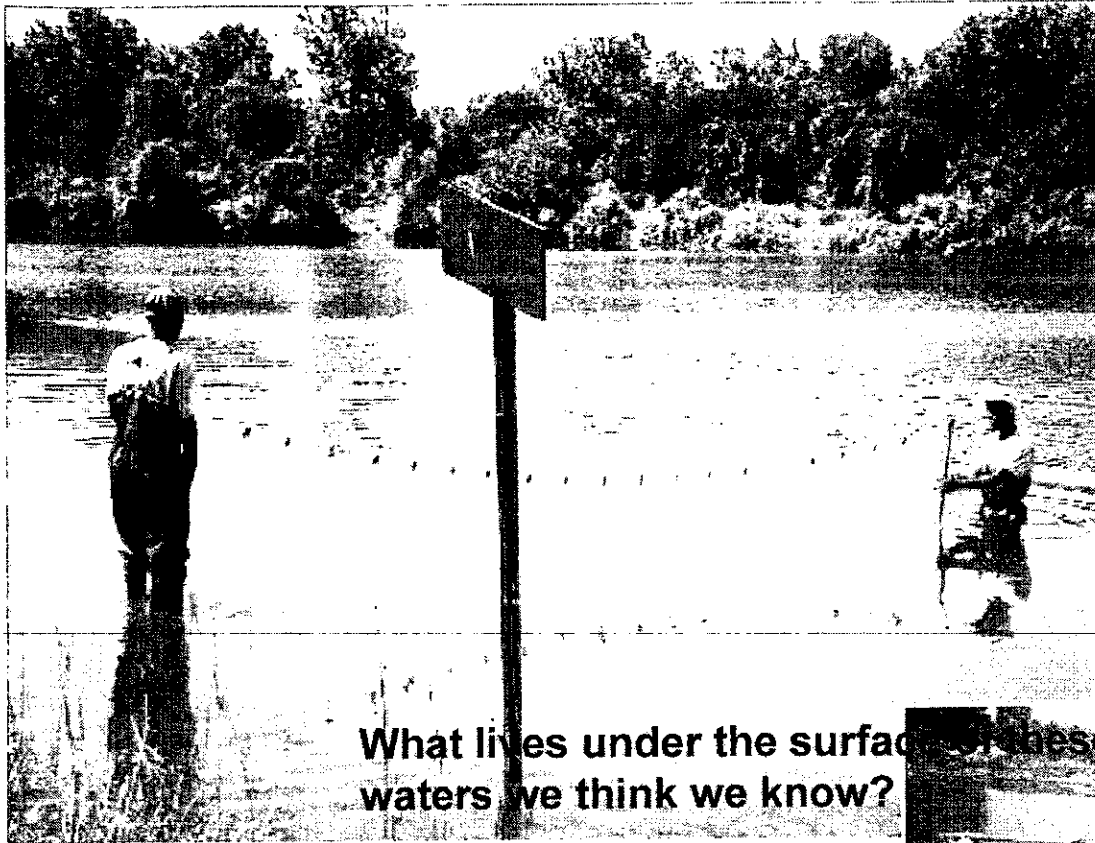
Materials and Methods

The site is one of the few South Side Recreational Parks with functioning wetlands and prairies. The site is heavily used and supported by community groups, individuals and families for a variety of activities including fishing, hiking, Bird watching and for environmental educational fieldtrips. Restoration and development of prairie, wetland and woodland were done in cooperation with South Side community residents and students from varying schools. The continued restoration work with the FPD, various community groups, individuals, and public and private entities is necessary to reclaim and restore this precious and rare site on Chicago's South Side.

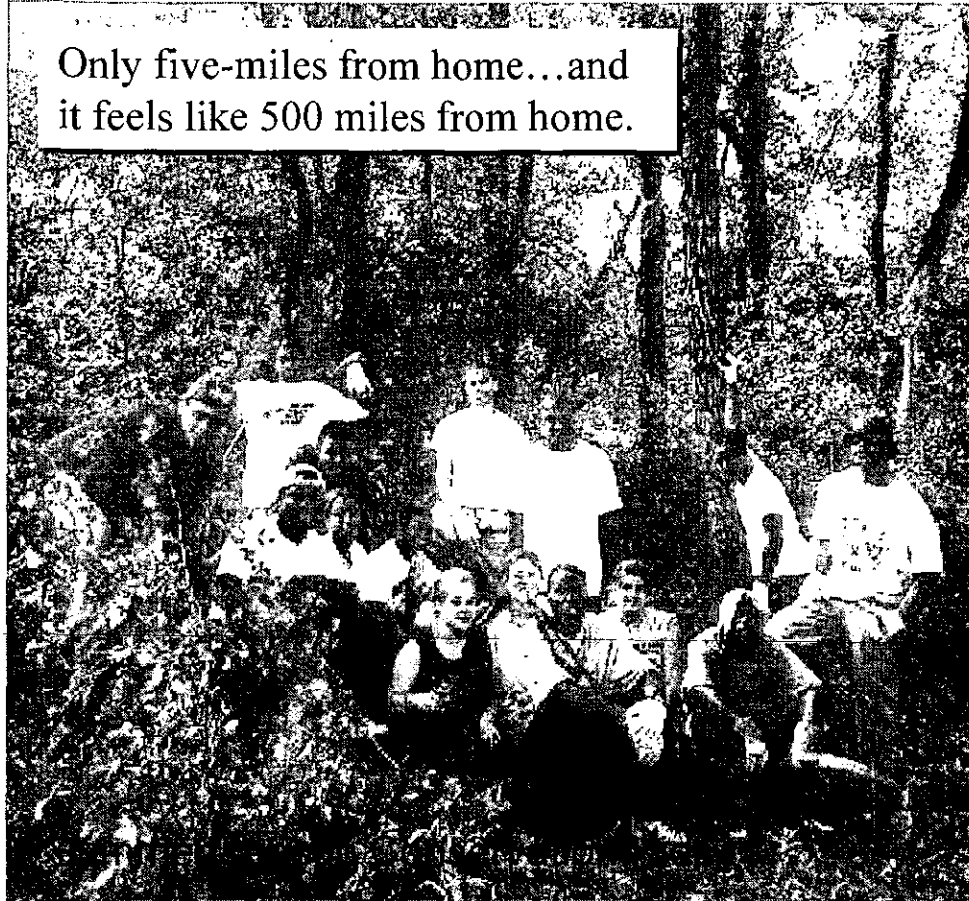

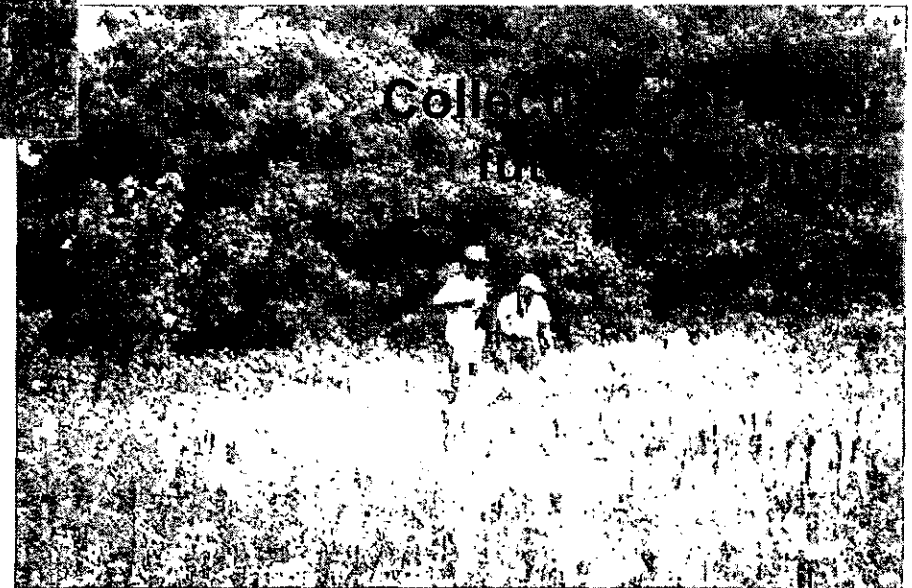
