Re: Reporting of Affected Acreage, FY10

At this time the Department is extending the deadline for FY10 affected acreage reporting from September 1, until Friday, December 31, 2010. The department is reminding all operators that a detailed map as outlined at 62 Ill. Adm. Code 1816.190 (surface mining activities) or 1817.190 (underground mining operations). must be submitted with their Affected Acreage report, showing the acreage affected.

Operations to be reported are surface affected areas for support facilities/infrastructures, mined overburden for surface mining operations, and highwall/auger mining areas.

The Department has made available the most current affected acreage form on our web site, www.dnr.state.il.us/mines/lrd/cfomrs.htm, and has attached one copy to this memo. Also attached are the regulations of 62 Ill. Adm. Code 1816.190 (Surface Mining Activities) and 1817.190 (Underground mining Operations).

In addition to the reporting of affected acreage, any operation in Illinois that has area under permit that has not yet been affected is also required to complete the required form, indicating zero acres affected. Areas previously affected and that have been re-affected during this period are also required to be reported. These areas should be included in the gross totals on page one of the form, and netted out on page two of the affected acreage form. Any reports found to have errors or use the incorrect form shall be returned to the company for correction.

Auger mined areas must be identified on the map.* Auger mining **IS / IS NOT** reported.

NOTICE-

This state agency is requesting disclosure of information that is necessary to accomplish the statutory purpose as outlined under 225 ILCS 715/1 (Ill. Rev. Stat., Ch. 96 ½, par. 4501 et seq.). Disclosure of this information is MANDATORY. Failure to provide this information could result in the issuance of notices of violation and ultimately bond forfeiture. This form has been approved by the Forms Management Center.

Mined Overburden

Areas to be included in this category include all land from which overburden has been removed and all areas where overburden has been deposited. Highwall and pit areas extending to the top of the highwall are to be included. Box cut overburden deposition areas are to be included.

Surface Affected Area

This area includes all surface areas either disturbed, affected or used in support of or ancillary to mining operations activities. Roads, tipple, ditches, sediment control facilities, waste disposal, soil stockpile, and storage areas are included; however, it may be necessary to include other areas also. Once an area is reported as surface affected area, it need not be reported again. In subsequent years, only newly affected areas will be mapped to show the initial year the surface was affected.

Areas extending laterally (out to the side of the direction of pit advance) which have been disturbed by soil removal and/or other soil removal but will not be subjected to overburden removal, must be declared under the surface affected area category.

Those areas affected in advance of the highwall that have experienced only surface soil or root medium removal and will not be mined (not to experience overburden removal) must be mapped and the acreage included in this category.

This category also includes those operations having surface mining activities which recover coal from a deposit that is not in its original geologic location such as coal waste disposal areas, (i.e., carbon recovery operations).

Soil Removal Only

This category includes all areas from which only surface soil and/or root medium has been removed or stockpiled or other disturbed areas (i.e., ditches, roads) that will be **surface mined** at a later date.

Reaffected Acreage

Auger Mining

Areas auger mined must identify where augering has occurred by individual seams.

TITLE 62: MINING CHAPTER I: DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES PART 1816 PERMANENT PROGRAM PERFORMANCE STANDARDS – SURFACE MINING ACTIVITIES SECTION 1816.190 AFFECTED ACREAGE MAP

Section 1816.190 Affected Acreage Map

- a) On or before September 1 of each year every permit holder shall submit to the Department reports and maps of affected areas.
- b) Two copies, plus one additional copy for each county in which the permit is located, of the reports and maps shall be submitted showing the area affected during the fiscal year just ended and the extent of any auger mining. One of the copies submitted shall contain the original signature of a company official. The Department shall require the map to be executed by an engineer registered in accordance with the Professional Engineering Practice Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 325] or a land surveyor registered in accordance with the Illinois Professional Land Surveyor Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 330]. The Department shall then forward one copy to the county clerk.
- c) The map shall be planned as a continuous map, so that the area affected each year may be added and indicated on the map by the dates it was affected. Reports as required by Section 1816.190 shall be submitted to the Department on forms provided by the Department. Map scales shall be in accordance with 62 Ill. Adm. Code 1779.25.
- d) All maps shall show sections, township, range and county lines coming within the scope of the map; access to the area from the nearest public road and all weather roads within the mined area; and a title containing name of the operator, address, scale of the map, by whom the map was drawn, name of the surveyor or engineer.
