Happy 30th Anniversary to Franklin Creek Preservation Area Committee

On September 25th, **The Franklin Creek Preservation Area Committee** celebrated their 30th Anniversary. Since 1987, the **Franklin Creek Preservation Area Committee** has been continuing their volunteer involvement by working to reconstruct the Franklin Creek Grist Mill in Franklin Grove. The original early American corn meal and wheat flour producing mill, constructed in 1847, was the "largest and most complete" grist mill in Lee County. The newly reconstructed Franklin Creek Grist Mill became operational in 1999. Now the **Franklin Creek Preservation Area Committee** operates and maintains the facility.
