# FRIENDS GROUPS PLANTED THE SEEDS NOW THEY NEED YOU!

## FRANKLIN CREEK PRESERVATION AREA COMMITTEE

The FCPAC was established in 1981 and was the first volunteer organization in the state to improve idle, state-owned land for park purposes through volunteer efforts. The FCPAC is a 501c(3) non-profit organization. Working with IDNR, the 882 acre **Franklin Creek State Natural Area** was created in 1982. The Park is located in *in Lee County*. The committee constructed roads, shelters, picnic tables, restrooms, ran underground electric lines, drilled wells, and cleared hiking trails. The park contains a 198 acre nature preserve. In 1992, the FCPAC started the reconstruction of the historic Franklin Creek Grist Mill that was originally built in 1847. The construction was completed in 1999 and the FCPAC still operates and maintains the Mill at no cost to the State of Illinois. In 2006 the FCPAC built a handicapped accessible fishing pier on the Franklin Creek Mill Pond.

Lately, the committee has taken on the task to acquire and preserve private property adjacent to the Franklin Creek State Natural Area and/or the Franklin Creek as it becomes available to keep it from being commercially developed. Our first success was acquiring an 80 acre tract of land that went up for sale in 2009. We are in the process of restoring and preserving this unique natural land and ecosystem. The FCPAC works in cooperation with the IDNR, the Nature Conservancy, the Natural Land Institute, the Dixon Park District, the Natural Area Guardians and the Future Farmers of America.

Our meetings are held on the fourth Thursday of the month at the Franklin Creek Grist Mill and Interpretive Center and all interested people are welcome to attend. We are currently looking for prospective directors and volunteers to be guides in the Grist Mill. We also would like any help from people that have experience in fund raising and writing grant applications. 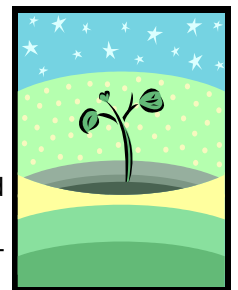

## CACHE RIVER STATE NATURAL AREA

Volunteer Opportunities at **Cache River State Natural Area** in *Johnson County*:

\***Cache River Nature Fest**, Saturday, April 24, 8a.m.-4p.m. Volunteers may assist regular site volunteers and site staff with programs and activities such as a guided nature hike, guided birding hike, children's activities, family activities, set-up or tear-down for event, present a program on native plants, birds, mammals in wetlands, or other topic. Check the website for information at <http://www.cacherivernaturefest.org> on types of activities for that day.

\***Bluebird box monitoring**. April/May thru July/August. All nesting boxes are on the trail system at the Cache River Wetlands Center. About a two mile walk. Once nesting begins the nests need to be checked once a week either by staff or volunteers. There are usually two broods a year.

\***Walk-a-Trail**—check one of eleven trails and report problems such as erosion, down trees, needed repairs to signage and etc. Volunteer will be assigned one trail to check four times a year.

\***Cache River Wetlands Center Volunteers**—all year, assist at the front desk greeting/helping visitors; present wetlands film; answer phone; assist with groups scheduled for an education program; and after a program help reorganize education materials, etc. To volunteer for any of the above opportunities, contact **Cache River Wetlands Center** at 618-657-2064 or email Mollie Oliver, the Natural Resource Coordinator at [mollie.oliver@illinois.gov](mailto:mollie.oliver@illinois.gov).

## KIDS VOLUNTEER AT EARTH DAY IN THE PARKS

Registration is still open for several of the **2010 Earth Day in the Parks** events. Students and teachers throughout Illinois participate in Illinois state parks to take part in natural resources stewardship activities such as: planting native trees and wildflowers; building and installing nesting/roosting boxes; removing invasive exotic species and construction of fish attractors. The event is held in April and May. Dates vary by location. The first applicant who meets the criteria for each of the remaining 10 parks, will be chosen. Last year the State Parks were fortunate to have 1,466 students and 204 teachers contribute 2,932 volunteer hours. This is a great way for students to help the environment and wildlife, and participate in outdoor activities to increase their fitness and learn that their actions can make a difference in the world.

## THE I.R.S. AND VOLUNTEERS

This may be an appropriate time to discuss reimbursements to volunteers, considering April 15th is just around the corner. The I.R.S. has determined that reimbursements to volunteers could be taxable income and must be reported in order for you to be in compliance. Check with your annual income tax preparer if you have received any of the following:

- \*Reimbursement for travel or mileage while volunteering;
- \*A per day flat fee for volunteering;
- \*Reimbursement for an item you purchased for a volunteer event or program and you do not have a receipt for the item;
- \*Reimbursement for meals when volunteering, if food is readily available;
- \*Non-monetary volunteer award valued at over \$50.00.

There may be changes or more that is not listed, so be sure to do your research and/or consult with a professional.
