The Illinois Conservation Association, in conjunction with Pheasants Forever - Henry County Chapter & Rock Island County Chapter, and the Illinois DNR, is hosting an Introductory Wingshooting Clinic at the Johnson-Sauk Trail SRA on **Saturday, September 7, 2024**. To register, complete the attached Skill Level Assessment form and, if applicable, the attached permission form. The permission form must be signed by a parent or guardian for any participant under 18 years of age. There is a \$10 registration fee per participant, which is donated to the Illinois Conservation Foundation to support future youth shooting sports and Illinois DNR programs. Checks should be made payable to **Illinois Conservation Foundation**.

A fact sheet with information that you will need to review is also attached. Please send the completed Skill Level Assessment form, check and, if applicable, the signed permission form to the address provided at the bottom of this letter. A limited number of shooters are allowed per day; therefore, registrations should be submitted as early as possible and no later than Wednesday, September 4th. Your registration will be confirmed after we receive the forms.

Please be on time for the clinic. We will start promptly at 10:00 a.m. so you will need to be at the Johnson-Sauk Trail State Recreation Area between 9:30-10:00 a.m. to check-in. Lunch will be provided, but please bring your own drinks to stay hydrated for the entire event.

If for any reason you are unable to attend, call us at least 72 hrs. in advance as we typically have a waiting list. We will be able to accommodate someone else if you let us know you will be unable to attend.

JOHNSON-SAUK TRAIL STATE RECREATION AREA WINGSHOOTING CLINIC INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

SPECIAL NOTES:

- Participants must be 10 years of age or older, and at least 4 feet 6 inches tall and weigh 75 pounds or more to register.
- Introductory Wingshooting Clinics are designed for beginner/novice youth, women and men shotgun shooting students. Participants must legitimately be in either the "Never" or "Rarely" skill level to enroll in these clinics.
 Prospective participants with shooting skills beyond the novice level should consider registering for a Hunters Wingshooting Clinic.
- The Department of Natural Resources, the Safety Education Instructor, or the Wingshooting Instructor will remove any participant from the Wingshooting Clinic for disruptive or unsafe behavior.
- Wingshooting Clinics do not satisfy the Illinois Hunter Education Requirement.

DATE AND TIMES: Saturday, Sept. 7, 2024, 10:00 a.m. - 4 p.m. (Check-in 9:30-10:00 a.m.)

LOCATION: Johnson-Sauk Trail State Recreation Area, Kewanee, IL

DIRECTIONS: Directions to the Johnson Sauk Trail State Recreation Area follow:

- From Kewanee, IL take IL Route 78 north five miles to park entrance on the east (right) side of highway
- From Interstate 80 exit at Interchange 33 and proceed south six miles to park entrance on east (left)side of highway
- Once in the park, look for signs for the wingshooting clinic assembly area.

DRINKS/LUNCH: Please bring your own drinks to stay hydrated for the entire event. Lunch will be provided at no cost to wingshooting students.

APPAREL: Wear upper garments that do not restrict either side-to-side shoulder movement or up and down arm movement. Upper garments should not have snaps, buckles, buttons, or strap adjustments on the front side of the shooting shoulder. Bring a shooting or hunting vest **that fits reasonably well** if one is available.

FOOTWEAR: Wingshooting instruction and shotgun shooting are field activities. Wear comfortable but sturdy shoes or boots. No sandals or open toed shoes allowed.

EYE & EAR PROTECTION: Eye and ear protection are mandatory and will be provided. Shooting students with their own shooting glasses and ear plugs or earmuffs are encouraged to bring them. Students who wear prescription glasses or contact lenses should wear them.

SHOTGUNS: Twenty-eight gauge shotguns with shotshells will be provided. You may bring your own shotgun. Please call us (309/853-2425) no later than Tuesday, September 3rd to advise us of your shotgun's gauge so we'll have the correct shotshells on hand for you.

INSTRUCTORS: Wingshooting instruction in the field will be given by NSCA/IDNR Certified Wingshooting Instructors.

SPONSORS: The Wingshooting Clinic is sponsored by Pheasants Forever - Henry County Chapter & Rock Island County Chapter; the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) and the Illinois Conservation Foundation (ICF). The IDNR has been involved in training sportsmen and women through its Safety Education Section by sponsoring wingshooting clinics and through youth hunting programs for many years. The ICF supports youth activities at its Torstenson Youth Conservation Education Center in Winnebago County and by providing funding for youth outdoor activities throughout Illinois.
