To register for the Wingshooting Clinic at the Middle Fork State Fish & Wildlife Area on **Saturday, June 28 or Sunday, June 29, 2025**, complete the attached Skill Level Assessment form and, if applicable, the attached permission form. The permission form must be signed by a parent or guardian for any participant under 18 years of age. There is a \$10 registration fee per student to help with the cost of the clinic. Checks should be made payable to: **Illinois Conservation Foundation.**

A fact sheet with information that you will need to review is also attached. Please send the completed Skill Level Assessment form, check and, if applicable, the signed permission form to the address provided at the bottom of this letter. A limited number of shooters are allowed per day; therefore, registrations should be submitted as early as possible and no later than Wednesday, June 25th. An email will be sent to confirm your reservation and registration after we receive the forms.

Please be on time for the clinic. We will start promptly at 10:00 a.m. so you will need to be at the Middle Fork State Fish & Wildlife Area between 9:30-10:00 a.m. to check-in. If for any reason you are unable to attend, call us at least 72 hours in advance. We typically have a waiting list and can accommodate someone else if you let us know you will be unable to attend.

MIDDLE FORK STATE FISH & WILDLIFE AREA WINGSHOOTING CLINIC INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

SPECIAL NOTES:

- Participants must be at least 4 feet 6 inches tall and weigh 75 pounds or more to participate. Introductory Wingshooting Clinics are designed for beginning and novice shotgun shooting students. Participants must legitimately be in either the "Never" or "Rarely" skill level to enroll in these clinics. Potential registrants with shooting skills beyond the novice level should consider registering for a Hunter's Wingshooting Clinic.
- The Department of Natural Resources, the Safety Education Instructor, or the Wingshooting Instructor will remove any participant from the Wingshooting Clinic for disruptive or unsafe behavior.
- Wingshooting Clinics do not satisfy the Illinois Hunter Education Requirement.

DATES AND TIMES: Saturday, June 28 & Sunday, June 29, 2025, 10a - 4p ** Students may sign up for EITHER day

LOCATION: Middle Fork State Fish & Wildlife Area, near Collison, IL

DIRECTIONS: *From I-74*, take Exit 206. Travel 6 miles north to County Road 2400 N, turn right at the Middle Fork Wildlife Area sign. Proceed ¼ mile - the site headquarters is on the left. *From the north and west*, from Collison, go approximately 2 miles east to the T-intersection, turn right and travel ½ mile south to County Road 2400 N; turn left and proceed to the site headquarters.

LUNCH: Lunch will be provided at no cost for registered wingshooting students at the site headquarters building.

APPAREL: Wear upper garments that do not restrict either side-to-side shoulder movement or up and down arm movement. Upper garments should not have snaps, buckles, buttons, or strap adjustments on the front side of the shooting shoulder. Tank tops are discouraged. Bring a shooting or hunting vest **that fits reasonably well** if one is available. **A cap or hat is required.**

FOOTWEAR: This is a field activity. Wear comfortable but sturdy shoes or boots. No open-toed shoes or sandals.

EYE & EAR PROTECTION: Eye and ear protection are mandatory and will be provided. Students with their own shooting glasses and ear plugs or earmuffs are encouraged to bring them. Students who wear prescription glasses or contact lenses should wear them.

SHOTGUNS: Twenty-eight gauge shotguns with shotshells will be provided. Students with their own shotgun are encouraged to bring it. If the shotgun has interchangeable chokes, bring the most open choke(s) available (cylinder, skeet or improved cylinder). Note: Since shotshells will be provided, students bringing a shotgun must call <u>815/258-8474</u> by Monday, June 23rd to apprise us of the gauge.

INSTRUCTORS: Indoor classes will be instructed by an Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Volunteer Hunter Safety Instructor or a National Sporting Clays Association (NSCA) and IDNR Certified Wingshooting Instructor. Wingshooting instruction in the field will be given by NSCA and IDNR Certified Wingshooting Instructors.

SPONSORS: This Wingshooting Clinic is sponsored by the IL Dept. of Natural Resources, IL Conservation Foundation; Pheasants Forever - Champaign County; Pheasants Forever – Vermilion County; GunsSaveLife; and Gordon Farms Seed Company. These organizations are demonstrating their strong commitment to the shooting sports and firearm safety, to family oriented outdoor recreation and to effective public agency/private sector partnerships. The IDNR has been involved in training sportsmen and women through its Safety Education Section by sponsoring wingshooting clinics and through youth hunting programs for many years.
