#### Boating Accident Report - 1971

The following information is contained in Boating Accident Reports submitted to this Department on 83 reportable accidents which occurred during the year 1971, involving 119 boats. There were 29 fatalities resulting from drownings. Injuries to 73 boaters also resulted. Property damage amounted to \$73,800.15. Of the boating accidents reported, only three were rental boats. Fifty-six accidents involved one-boat; thirty-two accidents involved two boats.
