DEFINITION OF A HUNTING INCIDENT

A hunting-related incident is defined as any occurrence when a person is injured during actual hunting activities.

Type A hunting-related incident is any incident that causes injury or death of any person(s) as a result of the discharge of a firearm or bow during actual hunting activities.

Type B hunting-related incident is any incident while hunting **not** involving the discharge of a firearm or bow which causes injury or death of any person(s).

Type C medical issues or injuries suffered while in the field, but not caused by the act of, or during, the hunting related activities.

Type C Fatal -Hunter was en route back to his vehicle after archery hunting. When crossing a wooden bridge, a board broke. Hunter fell 3 feet through bridge, fracturing both knees and lower leg.

NOTE: Type A Fatal - Youth hunter was in an elevated treestand pulling up a loaded firearm by a haul line that was attached to the trigger guard. The victim was climbing the ladder up to the stand when the firearm discharged striking him in the abdominal area. Victim passed away 3 days later as a result of the injury.

Type B Fatal - Hunter was attempting to climb out of his homemade ladderstand when the camouflage netting blew over his head causing him to lose his balance and fell 8-10 feet . He suffered severe injuries; a ruptured spleen, fractured hip, fractured spine and broken tibular. He succumbed to the injuries four days after the fall. Was carrying his equipment and No Fall Arrest System was used.

Type C Fatal - Hunter slipped and slid into a deep pool of water while crossing a creek enroute to his archery stand to hunt. Hunter was unable to swim or pull himself from the water. There were a total nine (9) Type C incidents, of those 7 were falls from treestands while installing or removing their stands.
