PUBLIC NOTICE

FLOATING DOCK AND WATER TRAIL ACCESS ON THE FOX RIVER AT RIVERSIDE PARK BY THE KANE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE VILLAGE OF CARPENTERSVILLE

The Kane County Development Department, 719 S. Batavia Avenue, Geneva, Illinois 60134, and the Village of Carpentersville, 1075 Tamarac Drive, Carpentersville, Illinois 60110, have jointly applied for a permit from the IDNR, Office of Water Resources to construct a floating boat dock and water trail access at Riverside Park on the Fox River in Kane County. The property is located on the east side of the Fox River, approximately 900 feet downstream of the W. Main Street bridge. This public notice is being issued pursuant to State rules for the regulation of public waters.

The project is to construct an accessible floating dock system with an accessible pathway and a cobble stream barb to protect the dock for river access. A cofferdam will be placed in the River for construction. The dock includes a 4 ft. by 40 ft. single rail gangway with an 8 ft. by 16 ft. floating dock platform at its end. A 4 ft. by 40 ft. kayak chute will run adjacent to the gangway and a 6 ft. by 16 ft. kayak launch clipped to the floating dock platform.

The project site is located in the Southeast Quarter of Section 22, Township 42 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meridian in Kane County. A location map and a diagram of the proposed work is on the back of this public notice.

Plans for the work may be seen by appointment at the Northeastern Illinois Regulatory Programs Section office, 2050 West Stearns Road, Bartlett, Illinois 60103. Review of this project will be limited to the following issues: 1) Any obstruction to, or interference with the navigability of the Fox River; 2) Any encroachment on the Fox River; and 3) Any impairment of the rights, interests or uses of the public on the Fox River or in the natural resources thereof.
