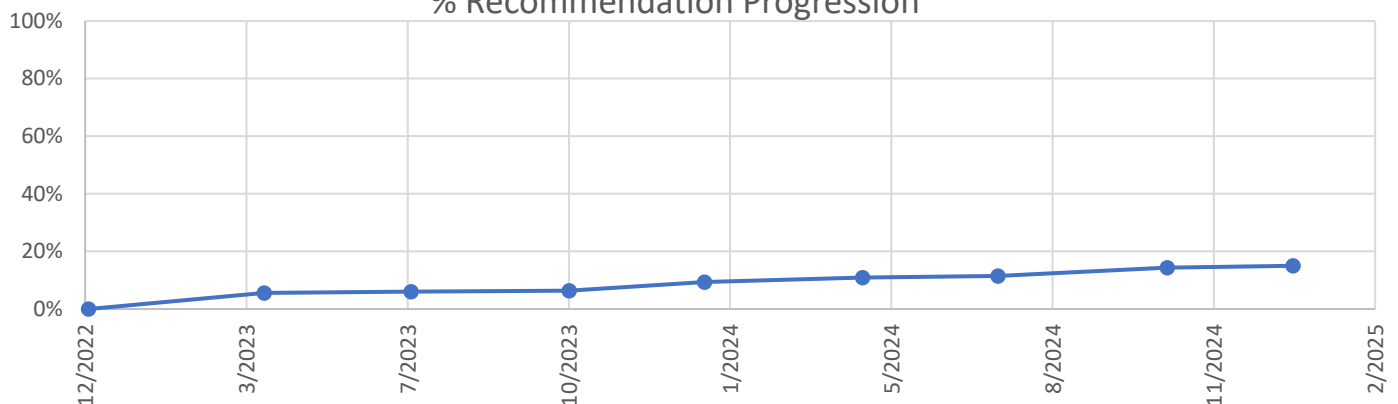

Operations of the Task Force

The State Water Plan Task Force met quarterly throughout the year on 1/8/24, 4/15/24, 7/8/24 and 10/21/24. The first three meetings were virtual and an in-person meeting was held in October.

Recommendations Completed This Year

- **Integrated Water Management #7** – Develop methodology for identifying and prioritizing underserved communities for water resource needs.
- **Water Sustainability #2** – Determine sustainable water yield for all water supply sources and share online.

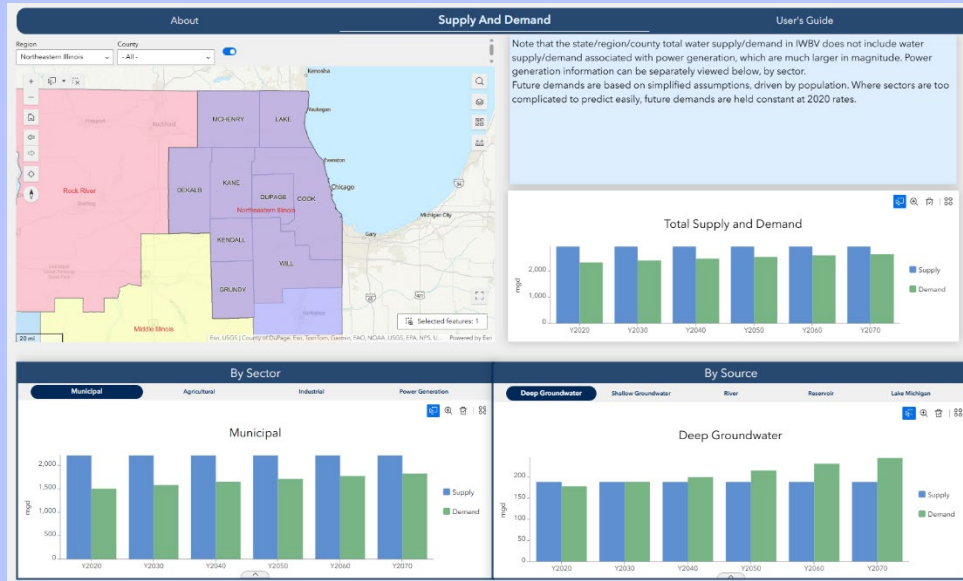

Key Progress

- **Water Quality #6** - The IEPA laboratory is certified to conduct analysis of Drinking Water samples for 25 PFAS analytes using EPA Method 533. The IEPA laboratory is being assessed for EPA Method 1633 on October 21st, 2024. The laboratory will be accredited for all 40 PFAS analytes in water, solids/sediments, and fish tissue.
- **Long Term Funding #1** - A Water Resources state fund was specifically established in statute in 2024 as part of the Carbon Sequestration Act.
- **Flood Damage Mitigation #1** - Update rainfall data by modeling future/seasonal data changes: Contract is underway with ISWS to develop this data with an expected completion date by the early of 2025.
- **Navigation #2** - Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) 2024, Authorization 12/3/2024: Inland Waterways Non-Fed match is going from 35% to 25%.
